Workgroup* Purpose

» To confirm that hospitals receiving state supply are compliant with the dosage-based assessment (DBA) process

- HepB
- Nirsevimab (RSV)
- PCV
- Pentacel
- Other

» Status reports required to the WVA Executive Committee and Board in February 2024

» If the DBA process cannot be used, the workgroup will develop a recommendation for an alternative assessment methodology**

* The workgroup is comprised of payers and providers who responded to requests to participate in a workgroup to address how to assess for state supplied vaccines administered to commercially insured pediatric patients in hospital settings.

** Currently, it is expected that the DBA process will be used.





Re-Cap 01.16.2024 Workgroup Discussion

- » Issue Summary
 - Certain inpatient hospital facilities currently receive certain vaccines from State supply, but do not submit a dosage-based assessment (DBA) for commercially insured child lives, resulting in assessment revenue loss.

» Solution Summary

- Inpatient hospital facilities will generate a DBA on a CMS-1500 form and submit it to the carriers for reimbursement to the <u>WVA</u>.
- Inpatient hospital facilities will include any, applicable administration fee on the UB-04 and submit it to the carriers for reimbursement to the <u>facility</u>.
- Should carriers deny any of the DBAs, the WVA Compliance Program will follow up with the carrier.
- Inpatient hospital facilities will be required to be compliant with the DBA no later than <u>June 30, 2024</u>.

Q&A

Q. What is this guidance intended to do?

A. This guidance was developed by a workgroup comprised of hospitals, payers, WA Department of Health (DOH) staff, and Washington Vaccine Association (WVA) staff. It is intended to assist hospitals, and the payers they work with, to ensure their respective billing and adjudication systems can support the Dosage-Based Assessment (DBA) process, which supports our state's universal purchase of pediatric vaccines.

Q. What is the Washington Vaccine Association (WVA)?

A. The WVA is a statutorily created 501(c)(3) nonprofit, distinct from the WA DOH, established by the Washington Legislature to fund childhood vaccines for commercially insured children under the age of 19. The funding collected by the WVA through the DBA mechanism is leveraged with federal funding to ensure that the WA DOH's universal Childhood Vaccine Program (CVP) can purchase vaccines for all children, regardless of insurance status.

Q. What is the Dosage-Based Assessment?

A. The DBA is a medical claim-like submission (837 or CMS-1500 format) from providers to commercial insurance carriers and third-party administrators (Payers) that is paid to the WVA to provide vaccine funding, and required by the State DOH's Provider Enrollment Agreement.

Q. Which inpatient hospital facilities are required to submit a DBA to the Payers on behalf of the WVA?

A. All facilities receiving state supplied vaccine from the WA DOH Childhood Vaccine Program (CVP) are required to submit a DBA for privately insured pediatric patients.

Q. When must inpatient hospital facilities be compliant with DBA submission? A. No later than July 1, 2024





Q. Which vaccines require a DBA? A. A DBA is required for all vaccines listed on the WVA Vaccine Assessment Grid given to a commercially insured patient under the age of 19.

Q. Are newborns required to be covered under the mother's insurance per the Erin Act? A. Yes. The DBA is submitted the same as for other claims for newborn services.

Q. Are inpatient hospital facilities required to screen and document patient eligibility in the Immunization Information System (IIS) prior to submitting the DBA?

A. Yes. Refer to the WA DOH's Eligibility for Publicly Funded Vaccines: A Guide for Providers to learn how to properly screen patients and document the correct eligibility status prior to inpatient DBA submission.

Q. What place of service (POS) codes should be used when submitting the DBA?

A. The list of inpatient facility POS codes for the DBA include: 19 - Off Campus-Outpatient Hospital; 20 - Urgent Care Facility; 21 - Inpatient Hospital; 22 - On Campus-Outpatient Hospital; 23 - Emergency Room-Hospital; 25 - Birthing Center.

Payers have provided some feedback.
3.	What is the universe of inpatient providers receiving vaccine from State supply?	DOH	Friday	 12.19.2023 – RECEIVED. 01.04.2024 – CLOSED. Added to 01.16.2024 meeting materials. Possibility of two more providers to be added.
4.	What is the associated leakage of the inpatient providers receiving vaccine from State supply?	DOH	Dec 31	12.22.2023 – CLOSED. DOH provided list to WVA by 12/22.
5.	What are the insurance requirements for infants prior to having a payer member ID for the infant?	Payers	Feb 1	CLOSED. TPAs do not have the same 30-day requirement period as commercial payers do. Added language to WVA IP Billing Guide.
6.	Using the UB-04 bill CPT and ICD.10 codes, is it possible for payers to create a settlement report and payment to the WVA if the CMS-1500-based DBA concept does not work?	Payers	Feb 1	ON HOLD . This is a backup solution if the DBA solution does not work and would require further exploration.
7.	What is the accuracy of inpatient eligibility screening?	DOH; Hospitals	Dec 31	Need DOH to examine; need to include in the assessments of participating providers. 1/3/2024. CLOSED. DOH stated it is required.
8.	Which hospitals use 3rd party providers (e.g., ER, specialists, etc.) and do these providers need to bill the DBA?	Hospitals	TBD	TBD.
9.	Does the hospital association have the ability to assist in hospital outreach efforts?	WVA	Dec 15	CLOSED. December 13 meeting scheduled with WSHA.
