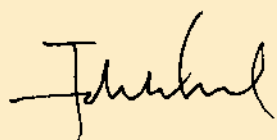


Dear Friends and Colleagues,

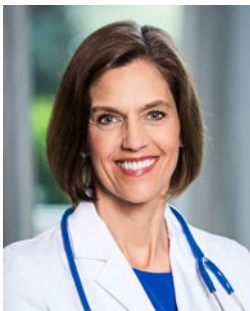
Looking Forward to the Next Fifteen

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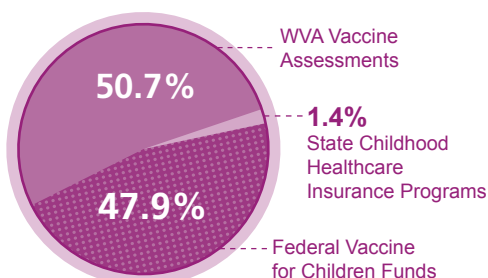


FY25 Financials
